CLRAH prepares for Regional Drill

The Regional Logistics Center for Humanitarian Assistance (CLRAH, for its acronym in Spanish), participated at the Regional Workshop on regional national protocols procedures for Humanitarian Assistance and Emergency Response, as part of the implementation of the Regional Mechanism of Humanitarian Assistance (MecReg/SICA), to be placed in force during the Regional Simulation and will take place in the Republic of Nicaragua.

The National Government presided by His Excellency Laurentino "Nito" Cortizo, President of the Republic, firmly believes in education, therefore together with Omar Smith, General Director of SINAPROC, the Centre is driving forward training activities such as this workshop. "We are convinced that the exercise results will be of great benefit for the Region", stated Alberto Sierra, Executive Director of the CLRAH.

CLRAH participates in the Water Security Workshop

On Sunday, 1st of September 2019, Mr. Alberto A. Sierra, Director of the Regional Logistic Center for Humanitarian Assistance (CLRAH, for its acronym in Spanish), jointly with his work team, participated before the Water Security Workshop - Identification of Key Areas of Vulnerability and Increased Resilience, with the support of the Coordination Center for the Prevention of Natural Disasters in Central America and the Dominican Republic, and participation of the National Civil Protection System.

The work platform of the CLRAH is centered on education, an important pillar of its administration. Within the framework of the World Congress "Water-Connecting the World", this workshop was developed to learn how scenario planning and visual thinking strategies can support the resilience of water security. The event was conducted by Dr. Anthony Masys with whom the CLRAH has made an approach to

establish a Teaching Program in Humanitarian Assistance and Logistics.

experiences shared, as well as a tour through the different Depots that conjointly make up the Humanitarian Hub.

Moreover, experiences encountered by the IFRC and the UNHRD were shared about the devastation caused

by Hurricane Dorian in the Bahamas. Also, future collaboration and work between the CLRAH and the COEL was evaluated. The visit ended with a tour through the administrative facilities and warehouses of their respective users.

Informative Visit with the Maritime Chamber



The CLRAH was visited by the Vice-president of the Maritime Chamber of Panama and staff, accompanied by 17 students from the Technological University of Panama, and representatives from the Maritime University of Panama, who were received by the coordinators of the CLRAH.

Said visit promoted initial collaborations between the Maritime Industry and the Academy with the CLRAH (Government), in order to establish capacity development through programs, training and educational promotion geared to humanitarian assistance and logistics.

A Visit to the Depot of the Office of the First Lady

Mr. Alberto A. Sierra, Director of the Regional Logistic Center for Humanitarian Assistance and staff, held a meeting with Ms. Mery Cohen, in charge of the warehouse of the Office of the First Lady.

The visit consisted on a tour through the depot and presentation of the stored inventory stored. Moreover, discussing the possibility of repositioning SINAPROC's inventory at their warehouse located at the CLRAH, and standardization of supplies to ensure procurement of homogeneous goods.

Counsel Sierra mentioned that the CLRAH is offering its support for the standardization process, as well as for the comparison of supplies from international users of the CLRAH, the specifications of the DAS, and the Office of the First Lady.

DisasterAWARE has been specifically designed to meet the needs of Disaster Management and the humanitarian assistance community, through improved tools and support functions for decision making.



CLRAH participates in the Incident Command System

The CLRAH participated through our collaborator Mr. Osvaldo Guerrero before the course termed Incident Command System (ICS), which provided a standardized approach to the command, control and coordination of emergency response, as well as valuable insights on preparedness before disruptive events.

For two consecutive days, collaborators from Panama Pacifico were trained by Panama Fire Brigade and personnel of the National Civil Protection Service, on the proper use of the aforementioned tool.





CLRAH and the CEPREDENAC fortify their capacities

Amidst preparation for the Regional Simulation which was coordinated and addressed by the CEPREDENAC, Counsel Sierra and staff partook in the Regional Workshop termed: Regional & National Protocols and Procedures for Humanitarian Assistance and Emergency Response.

As such, cooperation ties were fortified in the revision of the strategic guidelines for the design of the Action Plan defined in the Cooperation Agreement between Panama and the CEPREDENAC.



September 30, 2019

Hurricane Dorian strikes the Bahamas

"Dorian is a sample of the pulsating threat of the climatic emergency for Small Insular States in Development", declared Denis McClean from the United Nations Office for Disaster Reduction (UNDRR).

Panama, contributed with its part through the CLRAH by granting a rapid exoneration process for two aircrafts donated to the IFRC for this disaster.

International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies

As a first response to Operation Hurricane Dorian in the Bahamas, an Airbus A300 was dispatched from the warehouse of IFRC, containing relief supplies such as tarp typestores, collapsible drums, plastic buckets, tool kits, plastic tarpaulins, hygiene kits, kitchen kits and blankets for approximately 800 families.

Within the first week after Hurricane Dorian, and thanks to an additional flight donation sponsored by UPS, and additional 21 tons of relief supplies were dispatched from the IFRC's Depot, and then were transported and loaded on board its B757 to aid an extra 500 families in the Bahamas.

Fortunately, yet another donation was granted by Airbus allowing 40 additional tons of relief supplies, dispached from the IFRC's Depot, to be loaded on board the hold of the chartered A330 flight to aid an additional 1,000 families.

September 5 to 9, 2019

In October, we generated knowledge transfer and logistics adaptation

The container terminal of the IFRC warehouse was adapted to receive eight (8) 40ft High Cube containers to be used as back-up storage for relief supplies, should capacity at their main hold exceed its normal storage capacity.

Furthermore, a basic course in depot handling was granted to eleven members commissioned to Disaster Response of the National Civil Protection System, as well as to two members of the CLRAH; with the purpose of strengthening their logistics capacity, and hence, be able to optimize joint tasks. Between September and October, approximately 200 students from 7 different universities including Panama, Colombia and Peru, visited the Center.

INTRODUCTION OF THE "LCA" BEFORE THE LOGISTICS CABINET

The Logistics Cabinet was introduced to the project termed Logistics Capacity Assessments or "LCA", aimed to identify strengths and weaknesses of Panama in terms of logistics before a sudden off-guard catastrophe or emergency.

Mr. Alberto Sierra, Director of the CLRAH, mentioned that the project is being promoted by the World Food Program and provides the inventory of available logistics infrastructure of countries for humanitarian assistance in case of disasters.

Additionally, the aforementioned project will facilitate the development of logistics capabilities in humanitarian assistance, and as such contribute to Panama's preparedness by providing updated information for timely humanitarian logistics coordination and strategies in case of disasters.



September 26, 2019

FOLLOW-UP MEETING OF THE LCA

On Monday, October 7, 2019 a follow-up was had on the agreements established at the Logistics Cabinet pertinent to the establishment of the LCA Project for Panama.

Counsel Sierra brought-forth the advances achieved with the Logistics Cabinet, and mentioned counting on the approval on behalf of the State to obtain data from the LCA, as well as the methodology proposed for the project worktable

The CLRAH plans to hold meetings with GT (Georgia Tech) to know the availability of data and it was agreed that after this initial inventory of data, an indicator will be provided on all the data had preliminarily.

The LCA Panama is to set an example in issues of best-

practices, for it will have the direct support from the State, and the information from diverse government entities.

MEETINGS WITH THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

The CLRAH was invited by the Chamber of Commerce to participate at the upcoming Expo-logistic Fair 2019, to be held upon December 10 & 11, 2019, at the ATLAPA Convention Center, within the framework of the China Lac Event in Panama.

Participation of the CLRAH will include a presentation emphasized on Humanitarian Logistics as a new market and its traits during the conference cycles; as well as two stands to be located in the exhibition area; promoting a strategic relation with the private sector.

Similarly, the possibility of including a Humanitarian Business Roundtable formed by a Panama Bureau of Humanitarian Buyers before the forthcoming EXPOCOMER 2020, was discussed.

CLRAH'S ECOLOGICAL COMPENSATION AREAS

The ecological compensation product of the construction of the Center by UNOPS, 6 hectares of land have been reforested in two communities of the District of La Chorrera; the first being converted into two agroforestry farms: the Vocational School of Chapala (the very first ever located in the Province of West Panama), and the other one located at the "El Chorro de La Chorrera", basin to the Caimito River of the Province of West Panama, as an area of permanent preservation.

As to the one concerning "El Chorro de La Chorrera", such forms part of the restauration plan for this emblematic site, wherein native species of fruit and timber yielding trees have been planted, creating as such a biodiverse corridor.
